The competent Authority has approved the following guidelines for FTTH Services Connection in cases where area is TNF or copper based Exchange is closed in BSNL Area only:

Subject: Adjustment and recovery of Government dues from gratuity payable under the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021-reg.

The undersigned is directed to say that Department of Pension and pensioners' Welfare has notified the Central Civil Services (Pension) rules, 2021 in supersession of the Central Civil Service (pension) rules, 1972. Rule 67 of the Central Civil Services (pension) rules, 2021 deals with Government dues which can be adjusted and recovered from the gratuity payable to a Government servant under these rules.

2. As per Rule 67 of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021, it shall be the duty of the Head of office to ascertain and assess Government dues payable by a Government servant due for retirement on superannuation/ retiring otherwise than superannuation/ retired from service. The Government dues which remain outstanding till the date of retirement of the government servant, shall be adjusted against the amount of the retirement gratuity becoming payable.

3. The expression Government dues includes

(a) dues pertaining to government accommodation including arrears of licence fee as well as damages for the occupation of the Government accommodation beyond the permissible period after the date of

retirement of the allottee, subletting, unauthorized occupation, water and PNG Charge, if any;
 (b) Dues other than those pertaining to Government accommodation, namely balance of house building or conveyance or any other advance, overpayment of pay and allowances or leave salary and arrears of income tax deductible at source under the income Tax Act, 1961 (43 of 1961).
 4. rules further provides that only the government dues as referred as to in sub-rule (2) shall be adjusted against the amount of retirement gratuity payable to the retired government servant and any other dues which are not Government dues in terms of sub- rule (2) shall not be recoverable from the amount of retirement gratuity.

With reference to the above mentioned subject the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of competent authority for special provisions under CGHS to the beneficiaries aged 80 years and above in continuation of earlier guidelines in this regard as per the details given below.

- (a) Consultation of doctor at CGHS wellness centre without standing in Queue
- (b) CGHS Doctor shall enquire by phone at least once in a month to enquire about their wellbeing/ make a home visit if residing within 5 K.M. s of CGHS WC.
- (c) Settlement of medical claims on priority out of turn.
- (d) Follow up treatment from same specialist in non-empanelled hospital from where he/ she was earlier taking treatment- as a special case in view of advanced age and difficulty to change physician subject to the reimbursement limited to CGHs rates and collection of medicines as per CGHS guidelines.

Sub:- Clarification Regarding whether deduction towards commutation are required to be made from family pension for the remaining period in cases where the pensioner dies before the restoration of commuted pension- reg.

In Accordance with Rule 5 of CCS (Commutation of Pension) Rules, 1981, a Government servant can commute for a lump sum payment of an amount not exceeding 40 per cent of his pension further, in accordance with Rule 10-A of CCS (Commutation of Pension) Rules, 1981 the commuted amount of the

pension shall be restored on completion of fifteen years from the date of reduction of pension on account of commutation becomes operative in accordance with Rule 6.

2. Referenced/ representations have been received in this Department seeking clarification whether deduction towards commutation are required to be made from family pension for the remaining period in cases where the pensioner dies before the restoration of commuted pension.

3. It is clarified that in such cases monthly commuted amount of pension is not required to be deducted from family pension and family pension shall be paid in full without any deduction in this regard.

The banks were impressed upon to undertake this welfare measure, as this information is required by pensioners in connection with income tax, Dearness Relief payment, DR arrears etc. The banks welcomed the idea and expressed their willingness to provide the information.

2. Accordingly, the undersigned is directed to request all Pension Disbursing Banks to issue Pension Slip to pensioners after credit of pension on their registered mobile numbers through SMS and email (wherever available) also. Banks may also use social media apps whatsapp etc in addition to sms and email. The pension slip should provide complete details of monthly pension paid along with break-up of the amount credited and tax deduction etc. If any.

3. The CPPCs of Pension disbursing Banks are requested to ensure compliance of the above instructions for improving the 'Ease of Living' for pensioners.

Sub: Option for Central Government Employees to avail CGHS benefits either for their Parents or Parents-in-law- regarding.

The Undersigned is directed to refer to the office memorandum No. 4(1)-18/63-H, Dated 03.03.1987, issued by the Ministry of Health and family welfare, whereby a female Central Government employee was given the choice to include either her parents or parents-in law for the purpose of availing the benefits Under Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) Subject to the conditions of dependence and residence, etc., being satisfied.

2. The matter has been reviewed and the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of competent Authority to say that hereinafter, both male and female Central Government employee will have the choice to include either their parents or parents-in- law for the purpose of availing the benefits under CGHS subject to the conditions of dependence and residence, etc. being satisfied.

3. The contents of para 2 above shall be added to the definition of the term Family for CGHs benefits.

4. This OM shall supersede all other OMs issued in relation to this subject.

Numerous grievances have been reported against the operations of Various HCOs at this office. It is imperative that the HCOs strictly adhere to the following instructions, as any deviation from the specified actions will result in immediate consequences in accordance with the MoU.

1. Cashless CGHS Facility is obligatory for Pensioners & CGHS staff, and no advance deposit is required.

2. Do not demand a photocopy of the CGHS card.

3. Hospitalized beneficiaries and emergencies do not require a separate permission letter.

4. The stamp is not mandatory on the referral memo.

5. Prescriptions must be given in a printed form.

6. Prescriptions should strictly adhere to the government's policy by being in a generic format.

7. Dietary supplements should not be included in the prescription.

8. Establish a dedicated CGHS Kiosk (Help desk).

9. Double billing is strictly prohibited.

10. Ensure that the name of the nodal officer and contact number are prominently displayed. Any changes to the nodal officer must be immediately communicated to this office.

The above instructions are to be clearly displayed at the CGHS counter within 15 working days.

A CGHS hospital inspection squad will conduct surprise visits to ensure strict compliance with the provided instructions. Failure to comply will result in severe consequences.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Emergency treatment in CGHS empanelled Hospitals.

The extant instructions under CGHS provide that under emergency conditions, a CGHS beneficiary can get admission in any CGHS empanelled Hospital without any prior permission. It has, however, been brought to the notice that the Hospitals deny admission or insist on referral memo from CGHS wellness centre even in emergency conditions.

2. In accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement between the CGHS empanelled Hospital and

the Government of India, refusal to provide treatment to bonafide CGHS beneficiaries in emergency cases and other eligible categories of beneficiaries on credit basis, without valid ground, would attract disqualification for continuation of empanelment.

3. It is, therefore reiterated that in emergency the empanelled hospitals will not refuse admission or demand an advance payment from the CGHS beneficiary or his family member and will provide credit facilities to the patient.

The undersigned is directed to refer to above mentioned subject and to say that proposal for issuing guidelines & Ceiling rates for Lung Transplant and Heart Transplant was examined in this Ministry, In Consultation with Dte. Of CGHS and Dte. General Health Services. The under signed is now, directed to convey the approval of the Competent Authority to issue guidelines for lung Transplant/ Heart Transplant Surgery in respect of CGHS/ CS (MA) beneficiaries as per the details given below:

1. The ceiling rates for the surgery are as under;

- A) Lungs Transplant Rs. 25 lakhs
b) Heart Transplant Rs. 15 Lakhs
C) Heart & Lungs transplant (Combined) Rs.35 Lakhs

(ii) Government has constituted standing Committees for consideration for of requests for Lung / Heart Transplant cases from CGHS/CS (MA) beneficiaries as per the details given below:

Since, Lung/ Heart transplant surgery is a planned procedure, prior permission has to be obtained before the surgery is undertaken.

However, if for any reason it was undertaken under medical emergency to save the life of a patient, the standing committee shall consider the cases referred to them for consideration of grant of ex-post-facto approval, on a case to case basis.

(iv) Procedure for submission of Application:

a) CGHS beneficiaries shall submit the requests for permission for lung/ Heart transplant Surgery to the Additional director, CGHs of concerned city through the concerned Ministry/ Department for Placing the same before the duly constituted standing committee. Pensioner CGHS beneficiaries, etc., shall submit the applications to the additional Director of concerned Zone/ city through the wellness Centre.

b) In case of CS (MA) beneficiaries shall submit the requests for permission for Lung /Heart transplant surgery to the Under Secretary, EHS, MoHFW through the concerned Ministry/ Department for placing the same before the dully constituted Standing Committee.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Guidelines regarding purchase of medicines by Post- Organ Transplant Surgery patients under CGHS-reg.

With reference to the above mentioned subject the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of competent Authority to issue guidelines for the purchase of medicines in the cases of post -organ transplant CGHS beneficiaries as per the details given under:

1. CGHS beneficiaries , who are recovering from organ transplant surgery shall be permitted to Purchase OPD medicines, based on the advice of the treating specialist for up to a period of six months if they are not in a position to visit CGHS wellness centre or to send an authorized representative.

2. The reimbursement of such medicines would be considered as per the following details:

(i) The reimbursement on restricted medicines having CGHS rate contract, shall be limited to the CGHS rates.

(ii) The reimbursement in respect of other medicines for which there is no rate contract under CGHS, shall be limited to 85% of MRP or actual expenditure Incurred, whichever is lower (Since 15%) discount is the minimum discount prescribed under CGHS for local Chemists.

(iii) However, products manufactured/ marketed as food supplement, cosmetics and ayurvedic preparations advised by allopathic doctors are not reimbursable, as per extant CGHS guidelines.

Serving employees would claim reimbursement from their respective department.

BSNL Pensioners Pension Revision Case

But the Govt. made a writ petition in the High Court of New Delhi.
